Note: The Pali Text Society's original edition of the Vinaya Pitaka was published out of order, starting with the Mahāvagga and Cūļavagga before going back to the beginning to pick up the standard sequence. The confusion is further compounded by the traditional practices of calling the same text by different names (e.g., the Mahāvibhanga is also known as the Bhikkhuvibhanga); combining two texts under a single name (e.g., Mahāvibhanga + Bhikkhunīvibhanga = Suttavibhanga; Mahāvagga + Cūļavagga = Khandhaka); and dividing one text rather arbitrarily into two (e.g., the Suttavibhanga is often split in half after its fourth section to create two sub-volumes named after their initial chapter titles-i.e., Pārājika and Pācittiya-with the latter encompassing the remainder of the Mahāvibhanga plus the entire Bhikkhunīvibhanga).
